{Note Wivine: I am 64 years old now. For hundreds of years we celebrated Christmas at home in Belgium on December, 25th. We had a real Christmas tree in the living room that we decorated and we put small gifts for children underneath that they could open on Christmas day. A baby crib and statuettes of Mary and Joseph, shepherds and sheep, a donkey and a cow as well as the three Wise Men were also put under the tree. He came with Mary to the conclusion after several weeks that they were chosen to be the parents of the savior whom they had long awaited. When they arrived at this important conclusion, Mary hastened to Elizabeth.

Josephs dream.

Joseph couldn't get used to the idea that they would become parents of a special child before he had an awesome dream. In this dream, he saw a brilliant celestial messenger who said, among other things:

Joseph and Mary.

As a young man, Joseph went to work with the father of Mary. He helped create an extension to his client's home. When Mary brought Joseph a cup of water during lunch, they got to know each other and later they started dating.

Joseph was a charming man. He was very honest and fully adhered to the rules of faith of his people. He never talked much, he thought a lot. Mary was a cheerful person and had a brilliant mind. Joseph was a thinker and Mary a planner who could carry out his ideas in a convenient and practical way.

Mary mastered weaving very well. She loved to make their home warm. Joseph and Mary were both good parents and they made sure their children got a good education.

Joseph and Mary were married, as was customary at the time with their people, in the house of Mary near Nazareth. Joseph was twenty-one years old and they had been engaged for two years.

Then they moved to their new home in Nazareth, which Joseph had built with the help of two of his brothers. The house was at the foot of higher land with a beautiful view of the landscape of the area. They hoped that their first son would be born in this house, but could not know then that this event, which was so important for the whole universe, would take place in Bethlehem.

Jesus was later to be exceptionally kind and very caring with people like his father. Like his mother, he had a great talent for teaching and an extraordinary sense of justice.

The journey to Bethlehem

In the month of March of the year 8 BC, Joseph and Mary got married. In the same month, Caesar Augustus decreed that all inhabitants of the Roman Empire were to be counted in relation to tax collection. This was to be done for Joseph and Mary in Bethlehem.

It was only when Mary was heavily pregnant that Joseph decided to register them.

It was not necessary that Mary had to go to Bethlehem to register. Joseph could do it for his family. But Mary was an adventurous and enterprising woman. She was determined to go with her husband. She was afraid of being alone. The child could perhaps be born while Joseph was not present. Because Bethlehem was also not far from the city of Judah, Mary rejoiced to see her relative Elizabeth.

Joseph did not like the idea that Mary would join him, and he told her so but to no avail. Mary packed double the food needed for the journey of three to four days and made sure to be ready.

They left together early on a morning to Bethlehem. Joseph and Mary were poor, and since they had but one donkey, Mary, who was pregnant, could sit on the animal. Joseph walked beside her and held the animal. On their first day, they traveled along the foothills of Mount Gilboa. They camped that night along the Jordan River and discussed their ideas about the character of their soon-to-be born son.

Early in the morning, Joseph and Mary set out again. They ate their lunch at the foot of the Sartaba Mountain which offers a view of the Jordan Valley. They arrived at Jericho in the evening. It was a warehouse space for grain and was in front of the stables and feeders. There were curtains of hanging tents and they were glad that they still found a comfortable stay.

Joseph intended to leave immediately to register as soon as possible, but Mary was tired; she was not quite fit and asked him to stay with her. What he did.

The birth of Jesus.

All night Mary was restless so that neither of them slept much. In the early morning, they found out that the baby was going to be born soon. And at noon the next day, the son of Joseph and Mary was born! They received a lot of help from friendly fellow travelers.



Baby Jesus was wrapped in the clothes Mary had brought with her and laid in a feeder nearby. When Jesus was born at noon, the Angels sang beautiful songs above the stable of Bethlehem.

The day after the birth of Jesus, Joseph went to register. He met a man whom they had spoken at Jericho. The man took him to a wealthy friend who had a room at the inn, and was ready to exchange with them. That same afternoon they moved upstairs to the hostel, where they stayed for nearly three weeks, until they were given shelter in the home of a distant relative of Joseph. Eventually, they were over a year in Bethlehem, while Joseph occasionally worked as a carpenter.

The day after the 'Three Wise Men' arrived from Ur, who were send by Zacharias from Jerusalem, shepherds and other people arrived also to honor baby Jesus.

A religious teacher had announced to the three wise men in Mesopotamia some time before that he had had a dream in which he was warned that the "Light of Life" was about to appear on earth as a newborn baby. The 'Three Wise Men' went on a trip to find this "Light of life." But they could not find the baby in Jerusalem and nearly returned to Ur when Zacharias met them and told them that Jesus should be the object of their search.

Herod.
